Why is sydney airport closed

(Brook Mitchell)Airlines were left scrambling to notify passengers, many of whom were told of the delays moments before boarding.Airservices Australia said a replacement air traffic controller has since been called in but not before flights were impacted."We are working on all measures to minimise further impact, including accommodating additional flights wherever safe," an Airservices Australia spokesperson said."Airservices apologises to passengers affected by delays and cancellations, and we are disappointed that this has occurred so soon after our strong performance over the Christmas period, when ground delays were at record lows across the network."Virgin Airlines said it was communicating with impacted passengers and trying to get them onto next available services.It is understood most of the passengers will have to fly tomorrow.Meanwhile, commuters are facing their own delays after industrial action has caused 90 per cent of the train services to be cancelled this afternoon.Sydney AirportSydneyNew South WalesnationalAustraliaTravelCONTACT US Your web browser is no longer supported. There are calls for Sydney to become a 24-hour airport like Melbourne and Brisbane.It is the gateway to Australia for many international travellers, but for several hours each night it is closed.Unlike the 24-hour Melbourne, Brisbane and Perth airports, Sydney Airport closes its international terminal between 11pm and 2:30am. To improve your experience update it hereHundreds of people have been left stranded after a wild Sydney storm yesterday evening saw 23 flights into the harbour city cancelled.Other flights were diverted, leaving passengers from Qatar and Fiji stuck in Brisbane.And the city is waking to more wet weather today, after the storm left a trail of damage overnight.Sydney was smashed by a wild storm this evening, which prompted the diversion and cancellations of flights and brought down trees. Airservices Australia was forced to reduce the number of aircraft movements due to poor weather this afternoon but delays worsened when a staff member called in sick with late notice.As a result, 26 departures and 32 arrivals have been cancelled.Hundreds of passengers have been stranded at Sydney Airport after more than 50 flights were cancelled today due to an unexpected air traffic controller shortage. In short, Sydney Airport closes its terminals between 11pm and 2.30am due to a flight curfew.Passengers have complained about being locked out for hours without access to facilities.What's next? The situation is being closely monitored and further detailed warnings will be issued as necessary."Earlier, storms hit areas in the NSW Southern Highlands, with the tourist spots of Gerroa, Berry, Robertson and the area just east of Bowral all warned of storms and heavy rain.The Bureau of Meteorology (BoM) said while storms have eased, they may return. The wild weather led to the tarmac at Sydney Airport being closed for two hours and a number of flights being cancelled or delayed.Some flights arriving in Sydney from the Gold Coast, Melbourne and Canberra were cancelled after 2pm.Flights departing Sydney arriving in Adelaide, Hobart, Brisbane, Melbourne or the Gold Coast were also cancelled.Sydney Airport advised passengers to check the status of their flight with their airline.Qantas said three of its flights were diverted to Canberra or Brisbane during the storm.A Qantas Sydney-Perth return flight and three other flights between Sydney and Melbourne were also cancelled.By 4pm, the bureau cancelled its thunderstorm warning and said rainfall had eased around Sydney. "The immediate threat of severe thunderstorms has passed, but the situation will continue to be monitored, and further warnings will be issued if necessary," it said.Nearly 50mm fell in an hour at Kings Langley, in the city's northwest, while Belrose received 34mm in two hours.Near-stationary storms also caused downpours over Blacksmiths in Newcastle, with 65mm falling in less than six hours.-With AAP Your web browser is no longer supported. The domestic terminal is closed until 4am.Passengers who have missed connections or arrived extra early for morning flights have complained about being kicked out and forced to wait on the street.Entrepreneur and Planet Ark co-founder Jon Dee said he had a 6am flight to Armenia via Dubai on Monday morning.He decided to get the last train from his Katoomba home on Sunday night and arrived at the airport just after midnight.He said hotels were booked out or charging inflated prices due to Taylor Swift performing in Sydney.The airport experience can shape travellers' first and last impressions of the country. (AAP: Paul Miller)He said he planned to relax in the airport until it was time to check in at 3am, but was "amazed" to be told by a security guard to leave."When I went outside, I met this German lady who had a six-month-old baby, and she had to wait for two-and-a-half hours outside," Mr Dee told ABC Radio Sydney.Like him, she had assumed there would be somewhere to wait even if their flight wasn't leaving until 6am."I travel around the world, all the major international airports, the terminals themselves are open 24 hours a day even if they're not allowed to fly 24 hours," Mr Dee said. "That way, if you do arrive there, or if you're stuck, or the plane breaks down, there's some way you can get a coffee, somewhere you can go to the toilet, somewhere you can relax."Airport blames flight curfewMr Dee said it was "embarrassing". "We are the main entry point for most people coming to Australia and it's ridiculous that we're kicking people out on the street."Imagine if it had been a winter's night with rain, all of those passengers would have got wet. I think it's time for it to become a 24-hour airport."A spokesperson for Sydney Airport said the terminals closed to the public overnight for security reasons. "It's due to the government-mandated curfew from 11pm to 6am," they said.Loading... "However, we emphasise a common sense approach with our security contractor particularly around situations involving vulnerable people."We will follow this up to make sure our teams meet expectations around customer service and communication in the future."Mary Loonam said she had a similar experience when she and her friend arrived early for their 6am flight to Eastern Europe."I've got this friend who has to be early for everything, so we arrived at the airport by taxi and of course nothing was open," she said."And she suffers from quite a bad back that friend of mine and there was no way for her to sit or anything."She ended up sitting on a suitcase."Karen Burgess said she arrived at the airport at 2am to farewell her son who was travelling to the United Kingdom."There were probably about 20 to 30 people there ... I just thought it was hysterical. I had my nose pressed to the window looking at the guy polishing the floor."Leaving a good impressionAviation expert and Aviation Projects managing director, Keith Tonkin, said he was not surprised Sydney Airport was closed for a few hours given the flight curfew.He said there would be a "significant cost" to open the terminal facilities for a relatively small number of people who would need them at those times."It is unlikely that they would have had any airline staff and other staff that would want to be there necessarily, during those times if there was no scheduled operation," Mr Tonkin said.He suggested the airport consider providing some basic shelter to accommodate those people who were extra early for flights or have had their plans disrupted leaving them stranded.He said it was important to make the airport experience as smooth as possible."It's the gateway, the major gateway to Sydney in Australia for a lot of international travellers, and their first or their last impression can make a really big difference about how they perceive the place and how they reflect their experience to others," he said.
