There’s a lot to say for small trees. You can plant them in small yards without fear that they will take control of your lot or your neighbors. The falling leaves will not take you a whole weekend to wipe out. The roots do not lift the sidewalk. And you can plant more than one in your middle-sized courtyard. The Arbor Day Foundation describes a small tree up to 30 feet (9 meters) tall, while an average tree (such as blue fir or white oak) is 30 to 70 feet (9 to 21 meters), and large trees (such as sequoia wood or Ponderosa pine), are tall more than 70 feet (21 meters) [source: Arbor Day Foundation]. If you are looking for a focal point in a garden, some definition at a patio or bridge or want to create interest all year round with different specimens, consider the following selections. If you don't like showoffs, don't choose sweet acacia for your yard. This small shrub-like tree has wide spread lacy leaves and attracts attention with almost all year round bunches of yellow ball-like fluffy flowers that last for weeks. The flowers (which are fragrant) and the subsequent fruits attract birds and other wild animals, so if you plant this tree, wait for some visitors. But look at your hands, this tree has thorns. The sweet acacia will do the best in a warm and dry desert climate like Arizona or Texas, and is a characteristic of common landscape in the Tucson and Austin yards. It is possible to let this multi-trunk sample grow naturally as shrub or prunes far side limbs to create the appearance of a mono or multi-limb tree. On the next page,find a tree with an Asian taste. Japanese red maple can be used as a single sample tree or in a grouping. It hits in a rocky garden and is favored by bonsai growers. The leaves are dissected with pointed tips and provide a spicy green image with a spectacular red-violet showing in late autumn and again with new leaf growth in spring. This deciduous tree is native to Japan, China and Korea and can get hurt with too much frost and wind. In warmer geographies, it likes some shade protection, and can grow quite well under the canopy of larger trees. Japanese maple are useful next to the sidewalks and edges because the roots are compact and not invasive. It means that the stroller will not be cracked and raised in a few years by massive roots. Even in winter, the tree delights; in some cultivates the bark illuminates and turns colors after the leaves have fallen for the season. If you're looking for a tree screaming "American", the next page may contain the answer. The first plantation of a bossus in the United States was in 1653 at Sylvester Manor on the island of Shelter, on the Long Island of New York, using foreign bosses from Amsterdam [source: The American Boxwood Society]. Boxwoods are often associated with colonial architecture. So, if your house has columns or shutters or other colonial styles, a front casing tree would seem historically correct. There are about 160 registered bosses in the country. Some are dwarfs, growing onllya few feet up, and some grow up to 20 feet (6 meters). The American casing grows typically high from 5 to 10 feet (1.5 to 3 meters), and can be used as shrub or threaded into a tree. The leaves are dark, bright green on top and pale green on the lower side. It is possible to use them as a formal hedge, with pruning, or an informal accent leaving the tree go native. The American Boxwood Society calls Boxwood "the oldest garden ornament of man." While the ornaments are good, edible ornaments are perhaps better. The tree on the next page can provide some healthy snacks. When you consider small trees, why not think of a fruit tree? Most growers of fruit trees tend to be on the small side, about 20 feet tall (6 meters), which makes the harvest possible. After all, what good is the fruit growing 100 feet above you? The Moorpark apricot tree grows well in most of the country (some areas of southern Texas, Louisiana and Florida are exceptions) [source: Arbor Day Foundation]. The tree loves full sun and will grow fast enough at a height of 15 to 20 feet (4,5 to 6 meters). In the spring, after a winter without leaves, you will see what seems popcorn growing on the stems, and these will then grow in delicious milk fruits from July to the end of August. Be careful, however, that the birds will love your fruits as much as you. If the scented scents are more important for you than fruit, the tree on the next page will delight. With an abundance of scented lavender and purple flowers, the lilac has long been afor the garden, and it is popular as always with its nostalgic scent that signals that spring is sprouted. Like so many small trees, the lilac tree would be happy to live as a great shrub, growing up to 15 feet (4,5 meters) high and with a 12-foot (3,6 meters). But with a certain pruning and encouragement, the lilac works well as a tree of a single-stem. The lilac will grow well in full sun or partial shade, and is quite versatile to use either as a sample tree or aligned for a shading or privacy hedge. The flowers are durable, so do not hesitate to bring them in and throw out your chemical air cleaner in favor of the real thing. Speaking of nostalgia, the tree on the next page can remember the hospitality of the south. This lovely little tree is a sister of Betty, Jane, Judy, Pinkie, Randy, Ricki and Susan. They were all developed in the 1950s by the National Arboretum of the United States and are collectively as "The Girls" or the group "Little Girl" [source: United States National Arboretum]. These small magnolia trees provide a spectacular floral exhibition in spring, two weeks later than other magnolias, which means less chance of frost damage. The large purple red flowers of the Ann magnolia look like tulips, and the leaves are dark and prudent and survive well in drought or heat. This tree is hard and will tolerate shadow. But for the maximum in bloom, give it full sun. For variety, Ann's sisters bloom in shades of pink, red and purple. If you like flowers on a tree,next page describes an option to get that in your yard. this deciduous tree, also known as alternating leaf barrel wood, is native to the north-eastern part of the united states. grows up to 25 feet (7.62 meters) tall and its tiled branches arranged horizontally on the ground evoke the form of a Japanese pagoda. in autumn, the leaves turn mild shades of red and orange. at the end of spring, this tree puts out flattened bunches of white flowers which are moderately considered to be seen. In short, this is a tree with good manners. the pagoda dogwood seems good in a natural environment, rather than in a formal garden, and likes fresh, wet soil and also a little shade. and if you live in a colder climate, you and this tree should get along. on the next page, you will find a tree that can please both you and your friends of birds. While some crabapple growers are prone to parasites and diseases, this small compact tree is resistant to most of those headaches [source: university of rhode island horticulture landscape program]. the sargent crabapple grows about 8 feet (2.4 meters) tall and can reach more than 10 feet (3 meters) wide. loses its leaves in winter and in spring is covered with white flowers growing in small red fruits that are very tasty for birds. there are so many fruits, however, that their fall under the canopy tree could be a problem. this tree loves the full and humid sun, well-designed soil. grows well in the oda areas from 4 to 8, which includesof the country. to enjoy a very small specimen, you can transform this tree into a bonsai. for the color in the garden through a part of the winter, the next tree can be of interest. This specimen is on the large side of small trees, growing up to 30 feet (9 meters) tall and 25 feet (7.62 meters) wide. what it means, however, is more white flowers in late spring and the most shiny red fruits that can remain clear in winter, becoming particularly striking in appearance after the leaves fall in autumn. and as these hawthorn fruits are delicious for chants, you can have a winged choir in your yard, as well as a squirrel bevy. Washington, the Bianconeri are native to most states in the south and east of the country and love the full sun. This species resists fire, which can be a problem with other hamsters. our final tree, on the next page, has a long history of medicinal and edible purposes. this pretty tree reaches the 30 feet (9 meters) and has a rounded crown and drooping branches that fall in pyramidal shape. in summer, fragrant flowers such as the lily-of-the-valley appear and then turn into greenish yellow seed pods. in autumn, the glossy green leaves become yellow, red and purple. It is the largest member of the azalea family and grows indigenously from the south of the Illinois to the Louisian and Florida. sourwood gets the name from the sour-wood goth, which once were prepared for medicinal purposes.
